
Communication-Parents and School

Text Messaging: All important messages, including schedule changes, late start, early dismissal, and reminders will be sent out through Flocknote text messages. Please make sure we have updated cell phone numbers!





Sycamore Education: Holy Trinity School uses Sycamore to post attendance, report cards, lesson plans, and more. You can also utilize Pass-a-note to send us messages. Once your child is registered you will be given access to this site by a USERNAME and PASSWORD.

SeeSaw App: Holy Trinity Preschool will be using the free App SeeSaw. We will update it frequently with pictures, school projects, and important reminders. You can also use SeeSaw to send us messages. We do check this often! In the beginning of the school year we will give you a class code.

Monthly Reading Logs: Reading to your child is one of the single most important things you can do for your child! Each month we will send home a reading log. Each time you read a book they will color a picture. When it is complete they can return it to school for a special prize!

Snack Calendars: A monthly snack calendar will be sent home. You are responsible to provide snacks for your child to bring on their designated day. This calendar also includes; vacation days, special events, and reminders! (See attached sheet of snack suggestions)

Bussing: Bussing is provided for Jr. Kindergarten students after school if needed. The bus will pick them up at 3:20 and bring them up to Holy Trinity. Please contact Sheila Jueden at Cedar Catholic (402)254-3906 to make arrangements. You will need to sign a permission slip at the preschool open house prior to the first day of school.




SNACKS -Peanut Free School

Learning Experiences of Holy Trinity Preschool

Holy Trinity Staff must make a copy of the Birth Certificate with raised seal.

Section 43-2007 of the Nebraska School Laws provides:

"Upon enrollment of a student for the first time in a public school district or private school system, the school of enrollment shall notify in writing the person enrolling the student that within thirty days he or she must provide either (a) a certified copy of the student's birth certificate or (b) other reliable proof of the student's identity and age accompanied by an affidavit explaining the inability to produce a copy of the birth certificate."

Cost is \$15.00 if requested by mail, \$26.50 if ordered by phone or online with credit card. You may also obtain in person at the Yankton Courthouse.

If your child was born in any other state and you need information on how to obtain a birth certificate, please let us know and we will assist you.

This information is subject to change.

Warning: It is a felony to obtain, possess or use any copy of a vital record for purposes of deception. Penalty upon conviction is a \$10,000.00 fine or five years imprisonment or both.

Student Age Group	Required Vaccines
Ages 2 through 5 years enrolled in a school based program not licensed as a child care provider	4 doses of DTaP, DTP, or DT vaccine
	3 doses of Polio vaccine
	3 doses of Hib vaccine or 1 dose of Hib given at or after 15 months of age
	3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine
	1 dose of MMR or MMRV given on or after 12 months of age
	1 dose of varicella (chickenpox) or MMRV given on or after 12 months of age. Written documentation (including year) of varicella disease from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted.
	4 doses of pneumococcal or 1 dose of pneumococcal given on or after 15 months of age
Students entering school (Kindergarten or 1st Grade depending on the school district's entering grade)	3 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td vaccine, one given on or after the 4 th birthday
	3 doses of Polio vaccine
	3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or 2 doses of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age
	2 doses of MMR or MMRV vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month
	2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) or MMRV given on or after 12 months of age. Written documentation (including year) of varicella disease from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted. If the child has had varicella disease, they do not need any varicella shots.
Students entering 7th grade	Must be current with the above vaccinations
	AND receive
	1 dose of Tdap (contain Pertussis booster)
Students transferring from outside the state at any grade	Must be immunized appropriately according to the grade entered.
