#### Safe Environment:

Did you know in 2020 Unicameral in Nebraska passed a "grooming" law, Statute 79-879. This law makes grooming a crime if a pattern can be proven.

#### What is grooming?

Grooming is a common tool used by those who's intent is to sexually abuse kids. Some red flag behaviors may include such things as:

- 1. Continuously targeting specific kids for special attention.
- 2. Slowly isolating a kid from family and friends: emotionally and physically. For example, finding reasons for isolated one-on-one interactions.
- 3. Gradually crossing physical boundaries. For example, making kids sit in their laps; "accidently" touching private parts.
- 4. Encouraging a kid to keep secrets from family and friends.

One thing to remember is that grooming takes time. Most predators won't risk getting caught by pushing a victim to fast. One of the best defenses against grooming behaviors is to talk to kids early and often about their bodies and boundaries. Let them know if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable they can come to you or another trusted adult.



#### Circle of Care Is Making an Impact in Central America

In 2020, Sister Mary Rachel from the Diocese of Belize inquired about using the adult safe environment training in her home parish. Child abuse and neglect is still a taboo subject for many in Belize. She wanted to empower the adults in her community with the knowledge necessary to protect children. The Archdiocese of Omaha was very happy to gift the Circle of Care adult training program to her.

She has since reported back to us that not only have they been able to train adult mission volunteers but adults in other Belizian parishes and schools. In addition, they have also trained faculty at the local Catholic Junior College. She says, "I have been very edified by how this program has been received and how it clearly expresses our expectations for those who work with our children and youth."

The more adults in a child's safety net makes more people for the child to turn to if there is a problem. The question then is, how do I help my child identify "trusted adults"?

A couple of questions to ask your child when having a conversation about "trusted adults" are, "who is someone that makes you feel safe?" and "who is someone that listens when you talk to them?".

Another important aspect to remember, this special person needs to be available and aware your child has identified them as one of their "trusted adults".
