A Word from Deacon Filips...

Merry Christmas prayer warriors!

Yes, it is still Christmas! The world says that the Christmas season began on Thanksgiving, or maybe Halloween. In the church, and hopefully your home, the Christmas season begins with the first Christmas Mass and ends on the Feast of the Epiphany on January 7, when the Wise Men come. (These are the 12 days of Christmas.) What the rest of the world calls Christmas season is Advent, a time of waiting and expectation for Christmas, and a little solemn.

I think we should use this time to prayerfully consider what it means for God to come to earth to intentionally to suffer and die for mere mortals. We Christians like to think, "Oh yes, Christmas is about Jesus coming to earth for our salvation, not just Santa Clause." But do we really comprehend how amazing that is? God is so far above us in glory and power and we are so small in comparison that we cannot really grasp how amazing that is. All of the pagan "gods" of mythology, the Islamic understanding of Allah, and even the Jewish understanding of God teach that we are to suffer and serve God. Only Christianity teaches that God came to suffer and serve humans. The birth of Jesus truly is the pivot point in history when everything changed.

If we have been brought up as a Christian, we have "known" all of our lives what Jesus did for us, and it is a little too familiar; we take it for granted. There are a few days left in the season to ponder this. I recommend that you take this to prayer, preferably before the Blessed Sacrament, and focus on love and gratitude for what God, and especially Jesus, did for you 2000 years ago. Following is the next selection on the Mass from my book "Pearls of the Universal Church" available from www.spiritualworkspress.com

Music is the most important art because it is part of the Mass (see CCC 1156). In the extraordinary form of the Mass, High Masses are all sung. Gregorian chant was developed in the Middle Ages and is the most perfect Church music (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 116) because the congregation blends their voices, so they are singing together. The simple melody allows us to concentrate on the words and what they mean. Remember that we are to worship as a community and not as individuals and blending our voices helps that.

Catholics use a lot of symbols in our Church: holy water, incense, crucifixes, statues, etc., are used because as humans, we are both spirit and material body. "These are not just things, but symbols of deeper things." (Dean Koontz, 2012). Physical things help us to focus on and to get connected to God even if we do not fully understand the intellectual basis of our faith. God uses created things to reveal Himself.

The Church also specifies postures to be used during the Mass. (General Instruction of the Roman Missal).

We stand during dialogue with God or with each other while praying.

We sit when listening and meditating.

We kneel when Jesus is on the altar.

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS The Sword and the Family

In the first few weeks of parenthood, the tears flowed fast and freely, and with very little provocation.

Sometimes I wept because it was getting dark out, and sometimes because the sun was coming up. Sometimes I wept because the days were so unbearably long. Sometimes I wept because they were so cruelly short and slipped past so quickly, bearing away with them forever these inaugural moments of my daughter's life — moments I knew I would long for on my deathbed.

So, the inclusion of the Presentation of Christ in the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary has always struck me. The Blessed Mother, just a few weeks after giving birth, standing at the holy temple: Is she tired? Is she emotional? Is she frightened? Is she happy? We cannot know for sure, but if she is anything like most of the postpartum women I know, she is all four. But she stands there dutifully, offering her baby to the Lord, and this is what she is told, "A sword shall pierce your heart."

Joyful? I would have snatched the baby back, called the police and sobbed for a week.

But Mary knows that Simeon speaks the truth, and she cannot receive God's will with anything less than joy, even if it means a pierced

Family means love, but love means — what, exactly? Pleasure, fulfillment, contentment? Yes, but so much more, too. Love means you have much to lose. How full is family life with these beautiful moments which, on the surface, look and feel painful — but hold within them the opportunity to be like Mary, to bow our heads and once again say "Yes, Lord."


