FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK BY FR. OWEN KORTE

THANK YOU FOR ATTENDING: Thank you to all who attended our 40 Hours. Fr. Taylor Leffler did a great job with sharing with us on how to PRAY the mass. I learned a lot and it renewed my sense of praying the mass. We had 125 attend in Newcastle, about the same in Osmond and 145 in Hartington. Would I have loved to see more...yes. Am I glad for those who's faith was built up...also, yes. If I would see our 40 hours attended by a churches full of families—I'm sure the second coming would be right around the corner.

WHY COVER THE STATUES? The custom of veiling the images during the last two weeks of Lent hails from the former liturgical calendar in which the Passion was read on the Fifth Sunday of Lent (hence called "Passion Sunday") as well as on Palm Sunday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week, and Good Friday.

For this reason the period following the Fifth Sunday of Lent was called Passiontide. A remnant of this custom is the obligatory use of the first Preface of the Lord's Passion during the Fifth Week of Lent.

As Monsignor Elliott remarks, (Monsignor Peter Elliott's excellent guide "Celebrations of the Liturgical Year" published by Ignatius Press in 2002.) "The custom of veiling crosses and images ... has much to commend it in terms of religious psychology, because it helps us to concentrate on the great essentials of Christ's work of Redemption."

Although this is true, the historical origin of this practice lies elsewhere. It probably derives from a custom, noted in Germany from the ninth century, of extending a large cloth before the altar from the beginning of Lent. This cloth, called the "Hungertuch" (hunger cloth), hid the altar entirely from the faithful during Lent and was not removed until during the reading of the Passion on Holy Wednesday at the words "the veil of the temple was rent in two."

HOLY WEEK: Did Jesus not give his life for us on the cross? What can we give him in return? How about attending some Holy Week services to symbolize the gift we want to make unto the Lord.? Yes, it might be a drive. Yes, it might mean another church? Compare that to His death on the cross.

CHRISM MASS: On Monday of Holy Week all the priests of the Archdiocese gather with Archbishop Lucas at our Cathedral to help him bless and consecrate the oils that will be used in our Sacraments through the coming year. The Oil of the Sick, Oil of Catechumens and the Sacred Chrism are used in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Anointing of the Sick. At this mass the clergy and the Archbishop renew their vocational promises. Some of our kids will be attending the mass.

FIRST COMMUNIONS: Because of our full churches in many cases, we will have to have extra masses for our First Communions. When you see those advertised in the bulletin please know anyone can attend those masses. These are important sacraments and they rate higher than any prom or graduation.

OTHER EVENTS: Many parishes had special things they did for Proms or Graduations. We can't do it all like it used to be done. The normal mass schedule must be used for these events and then the main thing that is done at the mass is the kids are encouraged to participate: greeting, taking up the collection, bringing up the gifts, reading the readings and the petitions.

COMING TO THE END OF OUR CATECHETICAL YEAR: I want to thank all our catechists and Catholic School teachers who have ministered to our youth: teaching them and guiding them in knowing more about their faith. They work hard and sacrifice lots of their time. However, their work is almost worthless if the parents don't bring their children to church each weekend. PARENTS, YOU HAVE A GRAVE RESPONSIBILITY TO BRING YOUR CHILDREN TO CHURCH AND YOU WILL BE ANSWERABLE TO ALMIGHTY GOD SOMEDAY. YOU PROMISED TO DO THIS WHEN YOU ASKED FOR BAPTISM. YOU PROMISED TO RAISE THEM IN THE WAYS OF FAITH.

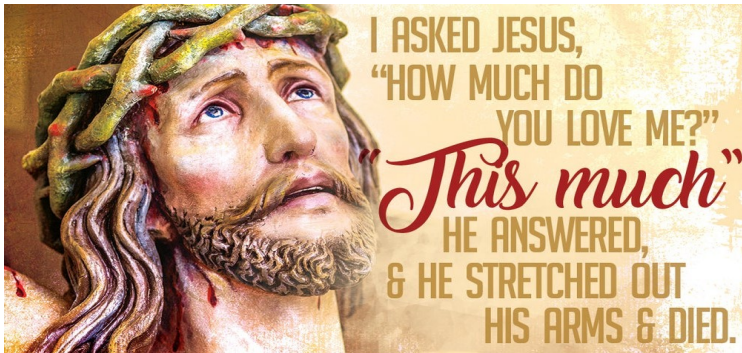

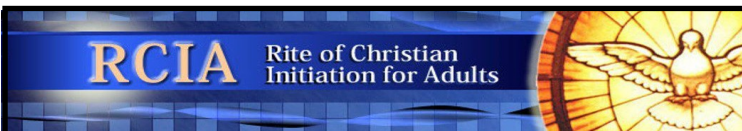

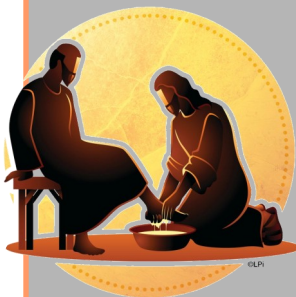

Holy Thursday Foot Washing

Q: What is the significance of foot washing on Holy Thursday?

A: Foot washing is an ancient practice of hospitality. In Israel Jesus' day, with its deserts and dusty roads, washing of feet was an act of honor on the part of the host. However, the host himself would not do the washing. That was the role of the servant. The Apostles would have been accustomed to this tradition. At the Last Supper, Jesus takes on the role of the servant, washing the feet of his followers and friends. He models the humble, loving service to which the Apostles would soon be called.

Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper. We celebrate many things, including the institution of both the Eucharist and the priesthood – *"This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me."* (Luke 22:19B). When the priest washes the feet of his parishioners, he is modeling the service of Christ. While foot washing is no longer a common practice in our society, we too are invited to imitate Christ's sacrificial service to others.

Properly Dispose of Sacramentals and Blessed Items
“Sacred objects, which are designated for divine worship by dedication or blessing, are to be treated reverently and are not to be employed for profane or inappropriate use even if they are owned by private persons.” (Code of Canon Law, 1171)

Never Throw Religious Objects in the Trash!
 Sacramentals have a sacred purpose in supporting our journey to heaven and physically signify our devotion to Jesus and Mary. Through the intercession of the Church, sacramentals supply special graces and dispose us to cooperate with them. This is why the Church asks us to handle them with reverence, even in the process of disposal.
 While all religious items should be treated with respect, when a religious object is blessed, it deserves a special reverence. Whether it is a marred garden statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary or a weathered St. Francis medal, any item that incurs a direct blessing from a priest is forever raised to a new level of spiritual significance. It would be inappropriate to throw these holy items in the trash!

Most Catholics know innately that the trash bin is not the place for blessed objects. But without guidance on their correct disposal, old and broken sacramentals tend to accumulate in a drawer or closet—never to be used again, but unable to be thrown away.

Steps to Dispose of Religious Items
 Follow these simple steps to dispose of your blessed items, broken rosaries, and other sacramentals that are worn beyond the possibility of continued use:
 The best way to dispose of religious objects is to burn them to ash. This includes anything flammable such as a cord rosary, Palm Sunday palms, or a blessed image printed on canvas. Then, collect the ashes and bury them, preferably on church grounds or in a Catholic cemetery.
 If you are unable to burn your religious items, they should be disassembled as much as possible and reverently buried. That way they cannot be used for a profane purpose if uncovered in the future. This is how you would dispose of a rosary with beads or a metal chain.
 Broken statues and worn medals cannot be disassembled further, so these are generally laid to rest whole. Holy water should be poured directly into the ground. Again, this is preferably done on church grounds or in a Catholic cemetery.
 If unable to burn or bury, reach out to your parish office. Parish staff are trained to collect these items and will dispose of them properly

We have the way you need to lay them to rest!
 From Palm Sunday to Divine Mercy Sunday boxes will be located in the back of each church for you to place any of these items in (burnable or not). Thomas Matya will take them to Omaha to be correctly disposed of.

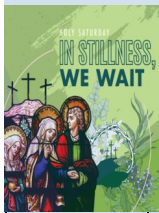
