

# From the Pastor's Desk by Fr. Owen Korte



MOVING CEDAR FORWARD: A CAMPAIGN TO PAY OFF THE REMODELING DEBT, GET SOME GOOD BUSSES, HELPING WITH THE BUDGET—

- You can stop over at the Development Office located at the main entrance of the Werner Activity Center to fill out a pledge form.
- You can also stop at the parish office to make your pledge.

### SOME THOUGHTS ON THE CAMPAIGN:

A Capital Campaign is always an opportunity to learn more about the school and especially how it is funded. There are four avenues of income that help pay the bills at Cedar, and there are numerous hands that help these avenues keep flowing.

- First of all, there is tuition: Families pay tuition for their children to come to Cedar.
- Second, there is parish assessment: For at least the past three years we have not raised the assessment for our parishes.
- Third, income from our Endowments
- Fourth, we are left with fundraising. Now, the Booster club raises money to help with the cost of our activities a lot of it, but not all of it. The rest has to come from the work of the Development Office.

So, I would like to say a few words about the Development office. Its budget and salaries are paid not by Cedar but by the Blue Ribbon Committee (50+) members whose gifts funds the office completely.

- 1. The development office has had to raise more and more money to make ends meet at the school.
- 2. The Gala is the largest fund raising event, but there's also the Fall Blitz and the Truck Raffle (although this goes to make debt payments the office still coordinates it).

- The Annual Fund drive: a mailing sent to all local constituents as well as Alumni.
- 4. Visits: Donors who are equipped to help more substantially are asked to contribute more to close the gap.
- Numerous other tools to keep the momentum going for Cedar are donor recognition, public relations, Blue Ribbon Committee memberships, Alumni Reunion etc.

Now, back to the Campaign. This is principally a capital campaign. It does have a small slice that relates to the yearly budget needs but that is clearly spelled out in the campaign. A small portion of the campaign will go to support the budget so that we can transition to the time when the Truck Raffle proceeds will go directly to the Cedar Budge. Until the debt is paid, we would like to have some cushion so that we are not scrambling at the end of the school year for necessary funds and to avoid raising tuition or assessments, other than maybe a little increment for inflation. Buses also have a small slice of this campaign. But, it is principally a building capital campaign to pay for the remodeling of Cedar.

**COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND:** Please call the rectory if you or someone you know is homebound and would like to receive communion.

IN A MONTH - OCTOBER 7th: We will have the blessing animals. At noon on Sunday, Oct. 7, the day we honor St. Francis of Assisi, we will have a blessing of animals in front of the Church. Not sure we can accommodate a 100 head of cattle being herded down Broadway, but in the blessing I will intend it for all the livestock of our parishioners.

PRAYER FOR OUR SCHOOL: A holy hour will be held in the Cedar Chapel, with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for one hour each Thursday beginning around 9am. Anyone can come and join in this prayer... in the midst of our school... for our students, faculty and for the success of all our school endeavors this year. This will begin on Thursday, Sept. 13. Students may come and make a visit during the hour... so let the Holy Hour be one of silence.

ESTATE PLANNING SEMINAR: The next seminar will be held at Bow Valley in the Church basement: October 14 at 4:00 pm The best gift you can give your kids is to make sure your affairs are in order. And if you want to help the Church or our school when you are gone, this seminar will help you learn how to do that with the best tax breaks. We have worked hard to bring you some great advisors, people who have lots of experience in helping people plan their estates and/or make sound financial decisions.

NOTE TO THOSE WHO NEED COMMUNION TO BE BROUGH TO THEM IN THE BACK: Sometimes the EMHC's cannot see clearly if there is anyone needing communion in the back of church: can't see someone if they are standing and others around are obscuring the view or the sun is beaming through the windows. So, I have devised a method of giving a signal: If you need communion brought to you put up the green circle on the wall next to the cry room. Otherwise, a red one will be on that spot telling the EMHC there is not need to go to the back. In know its cheezy but, hey, it might work.


