

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK BY FR. OWEN KORTE

CEDAR CATHOLIC NEWS: We are moving towards a change in our administrative leadership. The School Board last year chose to move towards a Lay President model for the School. A representative committee has been meeting to help rework our bylaws to reflect that change. This committee was charged with the goal of better uniting the internal life and the school's relationship with the external support systems. Soon we will bring the bylaws to various parish and school groups for their review and input. There have been many changes in how these kinds of documents are written over the years and the new format follows one that is being used by Pope John XXIII High School which was already approved by our Diocesan Attorneys. We have taken that document and tweaked it to reflect our needs and situation. Cedar Catholic Board has functioned as an advisory board to the priest-president and sometimes like a semi-jurisdictional board. Now the board will be more semi-jurisdictional with reserved powers spelled out as belonging to the Archbishop.


**NOTE TO ST PAUL PARISHIONERS:** Don't forget to make a good donation to the roof project. Doesn't it look nice? Time to pay the piper.

SOON TO BE FATHER MATTHEW POHLMAN: As you remember from last summer, before Thomas Matya began his time with us, Matthew Pohlman spent time with us. Since then Matthew has been ordained a Deacon; in Rome last October. He will be ordained to the Priesthood this coming June 1. Fr. Matthew will be coming back to our parishes for the 6pm mass on June 17th in Plainview and the 10:30am mass at Holy Trinity on June 18th. The weekend of his Ordination I will be in Omaha for all the events and Fr. Dave will be taking my place.







<u>The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ</u> The best way to understand the Eucharist is to recall God's long, careful teaching process beginning in the Old Testament. This week in Exodus 24, we learn the basic pattern. Moses reads the dictates of God's law to the people, who profess their allegiance to it. Then Moses takes representatives of Israel's twelve tribes and splashes the sacrificed blood of animals in two directions: on the altar and on the people. It's clear and serious business: clear, because the participants are entering a blood-bond with God Himself; serious, because the dead animals symbolize the life-and-death stakes at play.

Many centuries later, God uses the experience at Sinai to teach us something new. At the Last Supper, like a new Moses, Jesus proposes to "pour out" blood as a new covenant. It will land on the altar of the cross and the lips of his disciples. They have promised to be obedient to him who is God's law in flesh. This renews and elevates the breath-taking romance God wants with His people, unfolding from Sinai to this Supper. The Body and Blood of Christ is the sacrificial action whereby this covenant is strengthened.

How hopeful that, like us, the Israelites and the apostles repeatedly fail to live up to their promises and discover that the blood of the covenant continually renews and refreshes them. Today the blood of Christ faithfully flows, to unite and renew, moving us forward toward where our great teacher is taking us. This week, we should say a renewed "amen" to God who so carefully teaches us how to be one with Him in this new covenant.

WE CAN PREPARE THE UPPER ROOM

We all know that person, don't we? Hey, maybe we've even been that

'I have a great relationship with God, but I don't go to church regularly. God and I are on good terms. I can talk to Him just fine on my own." There isn't anything false in these statements. It's important to have an intimate, even conversational prayer relationship with God. But the problem with this attitude is that it implies that churches don't matter. Community worship doesn't matter. Today, we are reminded exactly why that is so untrue. Why we need our parishes, our priests, and each other.

The altar of sacrifice is also the table we gather in front of, as a family, to become one with Christ in the truest and realest way possible, recreating the scene in the

Upper Room over and over again every time Mass is celebrated. The disciples were commissioned by Christ to prepare the Upper Room for the Last Supper. How can we take up that work ourselves? #### A Word from Deacon Filips...

#### Greetings prayer warriors!

This time of year, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi. To understand Corpus Christi, we must understand the pascal mystery. The pascal mystery is one of the fundamental doctrines of the church that we are all familiar with but maybe do not know or understand as well as we should.

The Pascal Mystery is the *intentional* passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus ...according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God. It is Jesus' taking our sins onto Himself and then dying to pay for them. This is what it means to say he died for our sins. The more we love, the more we are willing to suffer. To love perfectly, Jesus had to die.

In the Old Testament law, every head of household had to offer a sacrifice for his own and his family's sins. First, the Jewish man would put his hand on the head of the unblemished, perfect lamb. This symbolized the lamb taking on the family's sin. Then the lamb's throat was cut, killing it on the altar. The lamb's sacrifice was payment for the family's sins for that year.

We no longer need the blood sacrifice of tens of thousands of animals; Jesus only had to die one time to pay for all of man's sins for all of eternity, because He was the "perfect sacrifice" He is God. This is what we mean when we say Jesus is the "Lamb of God." John the Baptist said "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!".

We have an opportunity to participate in, and contribute to, Jesus' sacrifice at every Mass. Towards the end of the Eucharistic prayers at Mass, after the bread becomes the body and the wine becomes the blood, when the bells ring, and then there are prayers for us and the church, then Father lifts the host and chalice together, or if a deacon is serving, together they lift the body and blood, the priest is offering Jesus' passion and death for our intentions

This is the moment that you can attach your little and imperfect sacrifices to Jesus' infinite and perfect sacrifice, and it is all offered to the God the Father by the priest. Jesus allows you to participate in the salvation of the world. Not because He can't do it himself, but because He loves us and allows us to participate in His work. This is how you and I can contribute to the salvation of the world.

This month lets pray for the success of the upcoming Eucharistic Congress and for greater Eucharistic devotion, including among those who do not go to the Congress. Following is the next selection on the Mass from my book "Pearls of the Universal Church" available from www.spiritualworkspress.com

#### Liturgy of the Eucharist in three movements:

The altar is prepared, the collection is taken. The money represents time and effort, the first fruits of which we offer back to God as a sacrifice, The gifts of bread and wine representing the fruit of the earth are brought to the altar while a hymn is sung. The Priest asks that all of our gifts be an acceptable sacrifice to the Father. We can also offer all of our personal sacrifices here to the Father, such as our daily work and our sufferings.

The Priest exhorts us to pray.

Movement #1, the Priest consecrates the sacrament of Holy Eucharist to make Jesus present; The Eucharistic Prayer is the highlight of the entire Mass. It includes the "epiclesis" where the Priest asks that the gifts become the body and blood of Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit and the Consecration narrative recalling the words and actions of Jesus at the Last Supper.

Movement #2, we offer Jesus back to the Father as a perfect sacrifice with our smaller sacrifices attached; For the oblation the Priest (and Deacon if available) elevate the host and chalice asking the Father to accept the sacrifice of His Son, and our very selves, along with our joys, sorrows, and sufferings, so we can be brought into closer unity with God.

The Priest prays for the Church, both living and dead members, our Pope and Bishop, and anyone the Mass is especially offered for.

We sing or recite the Lord's Prayer and doxology. The usual posture is to fold your hands in the traditional manner. While other postures are also seen in many places these are not sanctioned in the Roman Missal, but are accretions added to the Mass. These innovations include holding hands and lifting the arms while praying, imitating the Priest's posture. The people should never hold up their arms to pray in Mass because this posture belongs to the authority of the Priest alone.

We exchange the Sign of Peace, usually a handshake, sometimes a hug, kiss, or wave.

Movement #3, we share a communal meal to renew our covenant with God and each other; The Priest, Deacon, and all other Catholics in good standing and of the proper age receive the Eucharist while a hymn is sung. Note, because a Catholic Eucharist is not just a shared, symbolic meal, but a sacrament of the Catholic Church, only Catholics without mortal sin, who have been prepared for first Eucharist may receive. Because it is the actual body and blood of Jesus, anyone receiving who does not believe it is Jesus' body commits sacrilege, or abuse of a sacrament. If that person does believe it is Jesus, he/she needs to be instructed in the faith and received into the Church so they can receive ASAP. To be continued...


